SATS Success!



A huge well done to all our pupils who have achieved significantly improved SATs results in Year 2 and Year 6.

This year the proportion of children working

at the higher standard at Key Stage 1 has risen sharply and is now well above the national average in mathematics.

In Key Stage 2, the greatest gains have been made in writing and mathematics. School's results are now much closer to the proportion of pupils attaining both the expected standard and the higher standard nationally.

We attribute these improvements to changes made to the curriculum, high expectations that are consistently adhered to in every classroom and a lot of hard work from our children, staff and yourselves!

We are confident that strong foundations are now in place from which Mrs Oram and her team can further build upon in September.

We would like to take this opportunity to express our thanks for the warm welcome we have received since joining Rowlands Gill Primary School last year and the tremendous support that has been offered. It is widely recognized that school has been through some
