Use paint brushes, rollers, sponges to make marks outside on the ground with water.

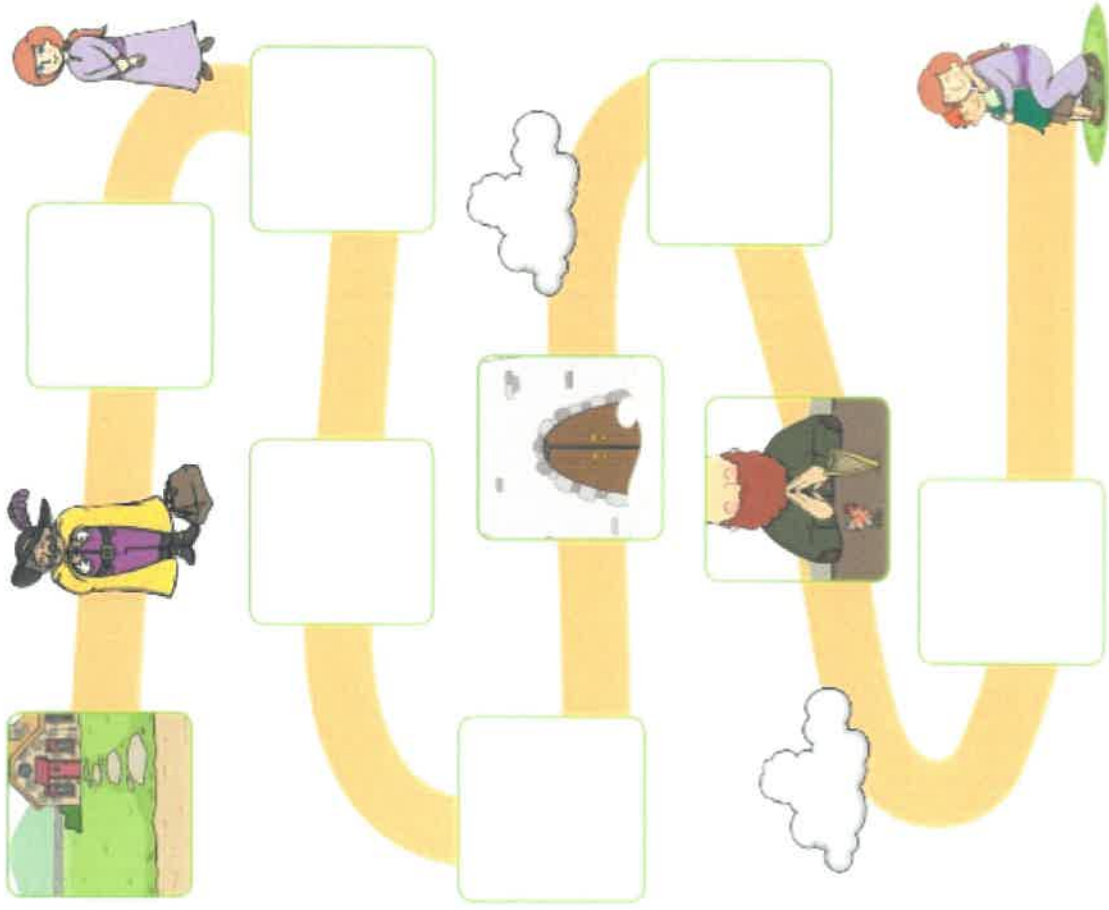
Activity

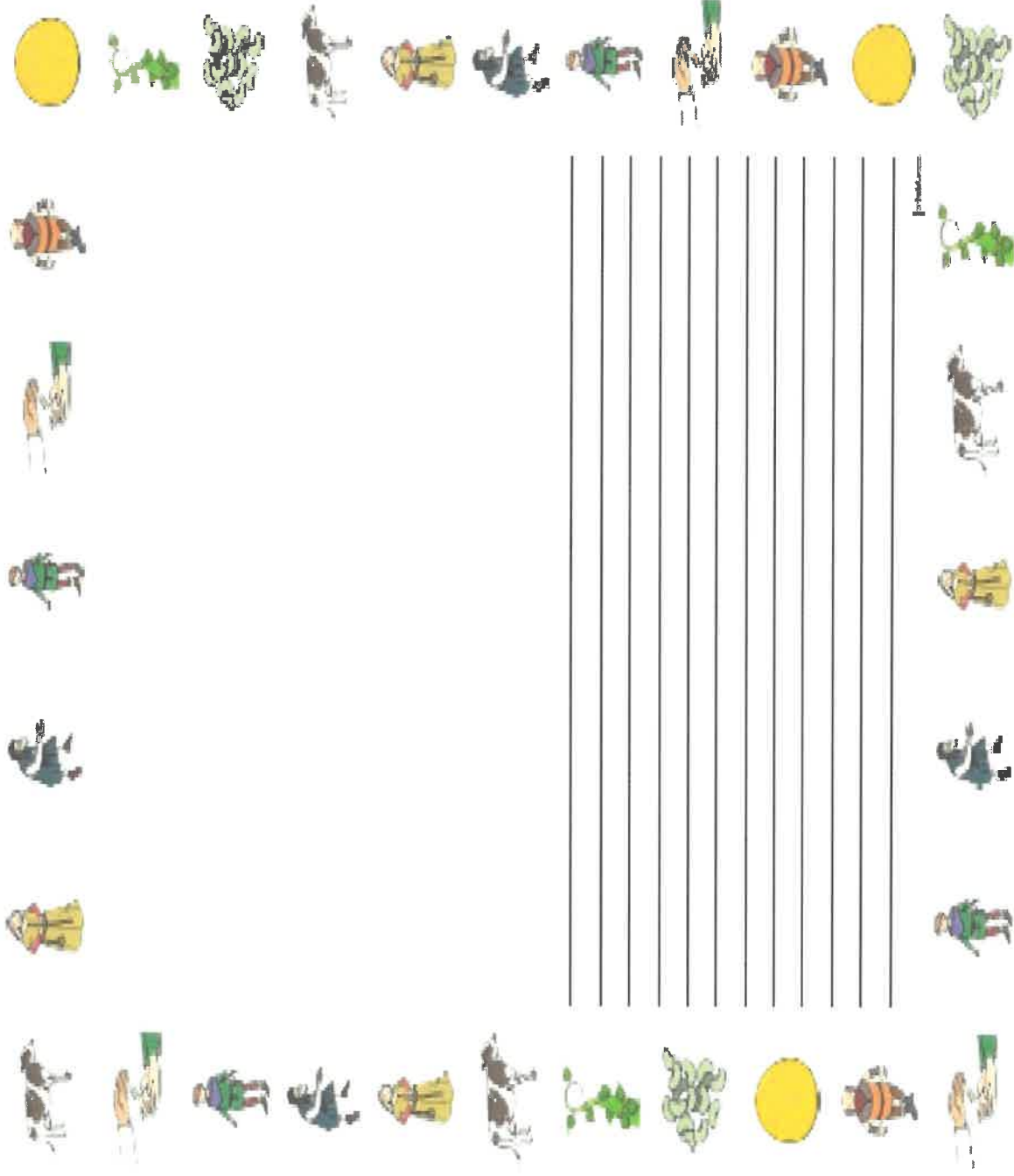
Challenge: Write your own story.

1 = red

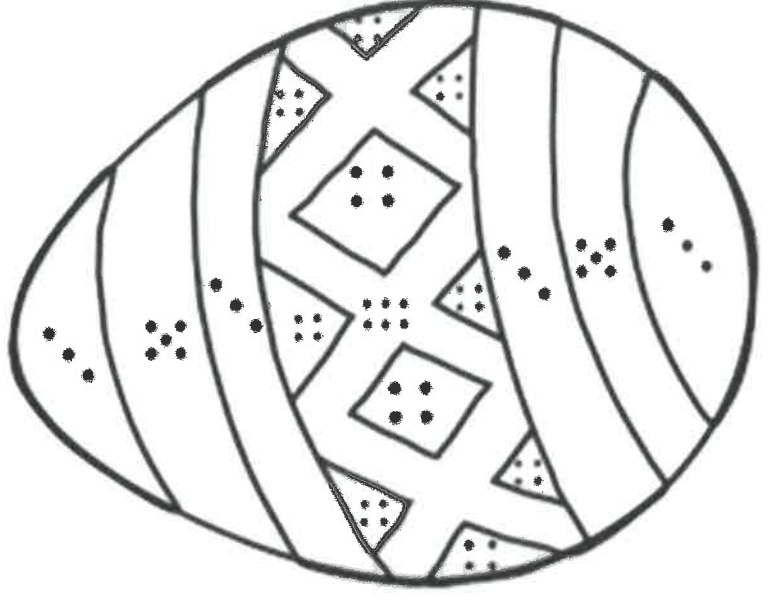
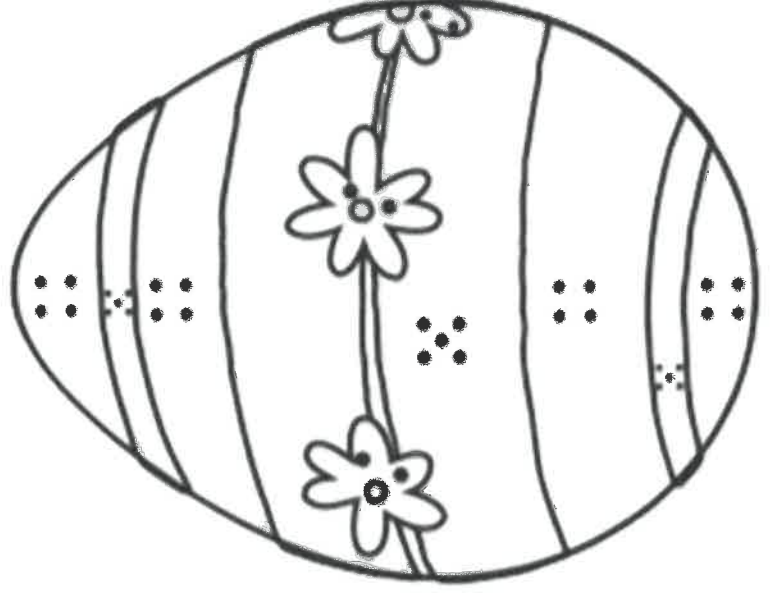
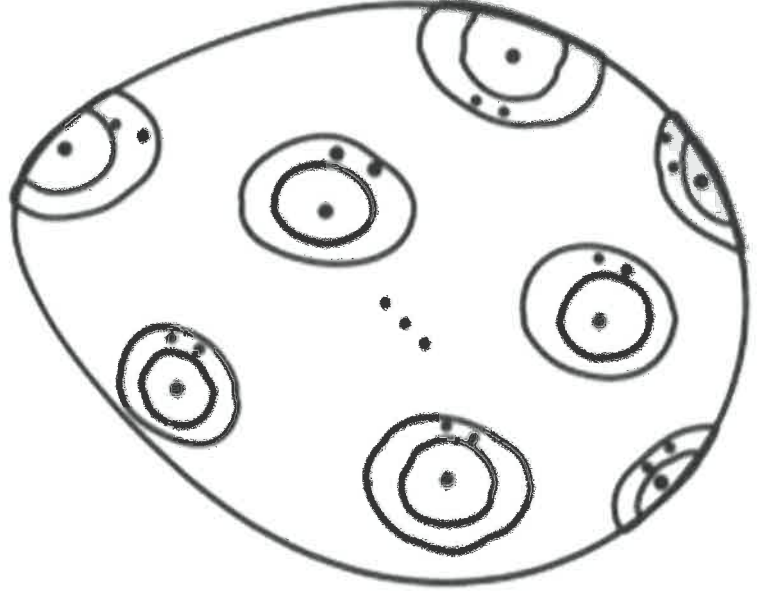

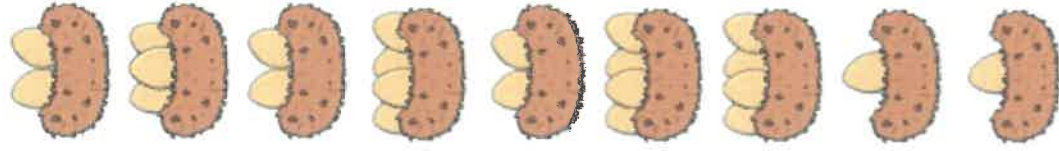

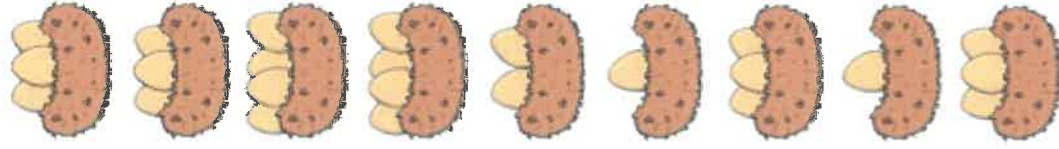


Eggs in Nests Addition

Write the answers in the circles.



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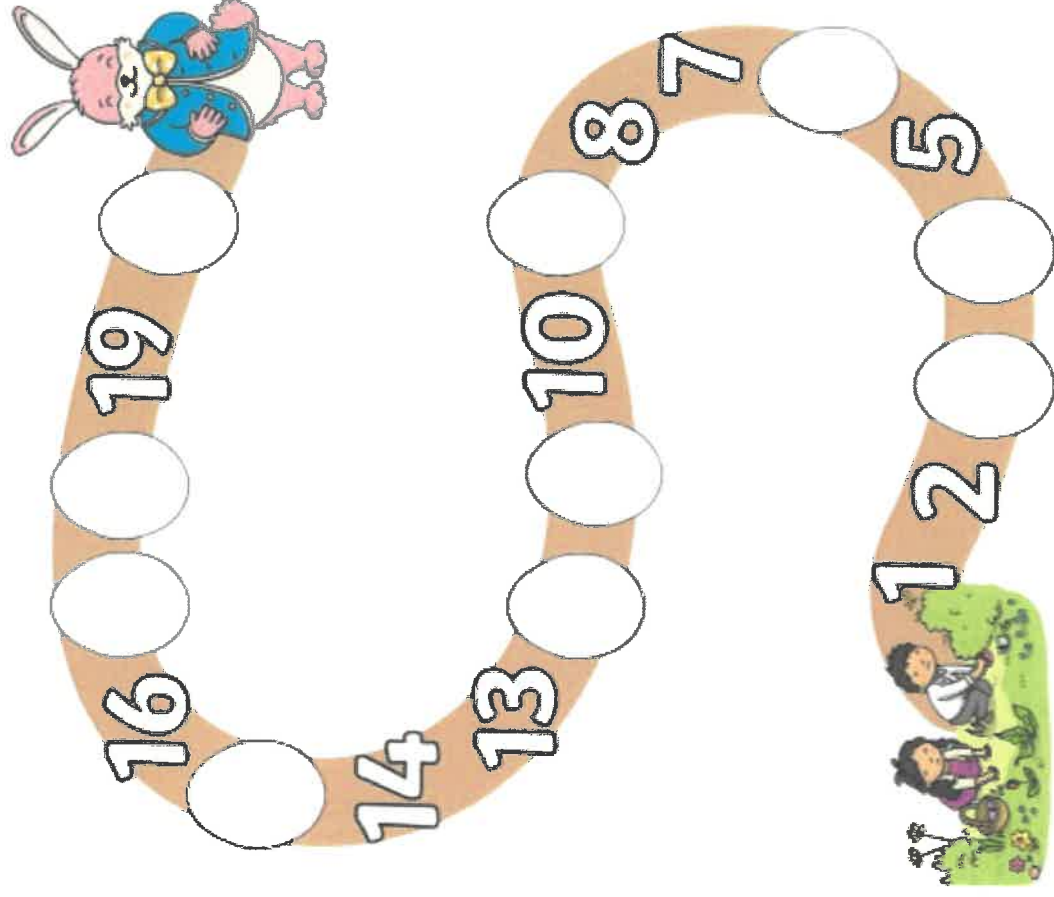


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Easter Bunny Missing Number Path

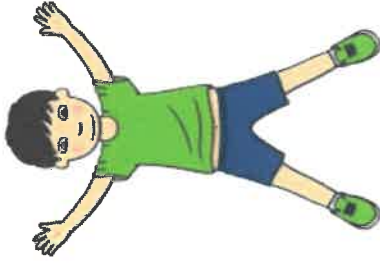
The Easter Bunny is busy hiding Easter eggs. Can you write the missing numbers along the path to follow the Easter Bunny?

Home Learning Challenge

There are 10

seeds waiting to grow in a flowerpot. If 4 seeds start to grow, how many seeds would still be waiting to grow? You could use your fingers or draw a picture to help you.

Try

making a model of a flower. You could use playdough, paper or card, construction toys, empty cardboard tubes and boxes or plastic tubs and pots. Think about how you could make the stem, the flower and the leaves. We would love to see any models you make!

Go

for a walk with a grown-up around a garden or park. Look carefully to see what plants and flowers you can see growing. You could take some photos or draw some pictures of the things you see.

Draw or paint a picture of some flowers. What colours do you need? Can you

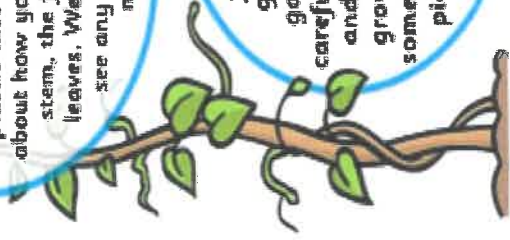
remember the different parts of a flower? Try using the words 'stem', 'leaves' and 'petals' to describe your flowers.

'Sunflower' is a

very long word for a very tall flower! What other words can you think of that start with 's'? Can you think of any words to do with flowers or the garden?

Try growing some plants or flowers at home. You could try planting

some seeds in a pot or in your garden. Remember to give your seeds some water and put them somewhere sunny. Cress seeds grow quite quickly or you could try planting some flowers.



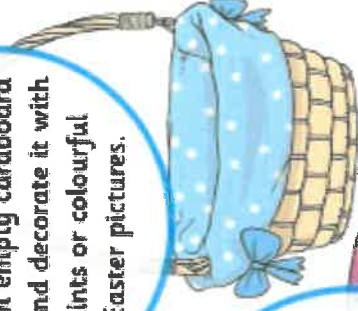
Easter

Home Learning Challenge

People often celebrate Easter by eating chocolate or buns and cakes. Try making a sweet treat to share with your family. We would love to see a photo or picture of any treats you make!



Try making a model basket to hold some Easter treats! You could use an empty cardboard box and decorate it with paints or colourful Easter pictures.



Egg starts with the letter 'e' – what else starts with the letter 'e'? Write a list of other things that start with the letter 'e'. How many things can you think of?



If there are 10 eggs in a basket and then 5 get eaten, how many would be left in the basket? You could use your fingers or draw a picture to help you.



Draw or paint an Easter picture – you could draw some Easter eggs, flowers, chicks or even the Easter bunny!



At Easter time lots of flowers start growing in the ground and on trees. Go for a walk around a park or garden and see what flowers and plants you can see growing.
