You will need: Pirate eyepatch template Black colouring pencil or felt-tip pen Scissors Elastic or string Sticky tape

What to Do:

- Colour in the pirate eyepatch template (provided). Remember to leave the skull and crossbones white.
- 2. Carefully, cut out the eyepatch.
- 3. Ask a grown-up to help you put holes in the eyepatch where the little circles are.
- 4. Get the elastic or string and put it around your head to work out how much you will need.
- 5. Then, thread this through the holes. This is a bit tricky, you might need a grown-up to help.
- 6. Use the sticky tape to keep the elastic or string in place.
