

### Rhyme Time

**Treasure hunt:** Grown-ups, set up a treasure hunt at home and use some pictures or toys with the initial sounds that match the sound buckets. Give your child a clue as to where the treasure might be hidden and when they find it they can match it to the correct bucket. Hide some real treasure in the last place. This could be a special snack, a new story to read or something special for your family.



### Reading / Mark Making

**Treasure map:** Make a treasure map just like in the story, don't forget to use a X to mark the spot. Dip the teabag into the water and smear it all over both sides of the white paper. Let the paper dry and then use coloured pens to draw on your map.



**Messages for friends:** Draw a picture or write a letter or take a photograph or short video to show your class letting them know what you will be up to this summer or what you are looking forward to in September. Miss Smales will share your messages / pictures on Tapestry for the rest of your class to see.

### Maths

Draw a large coconut tree on paper, or chalk outside on the ground, make 10 coconuts using paper. Show your child a number card and ask them what number it is. Can they place the correct number of coconuts on the tree by counting them out using one to one correspondence? This activity can also be repeated but instead of a coconut tree and coconuts you could use a treasure box and coins.

Make a pirate eye patch (See below). Keep practising those cutting skills using scissors.



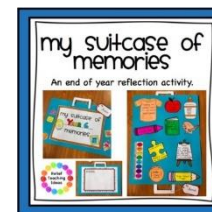
### Understanding the world

Thank you for all your support this year and continuing with your home learning.

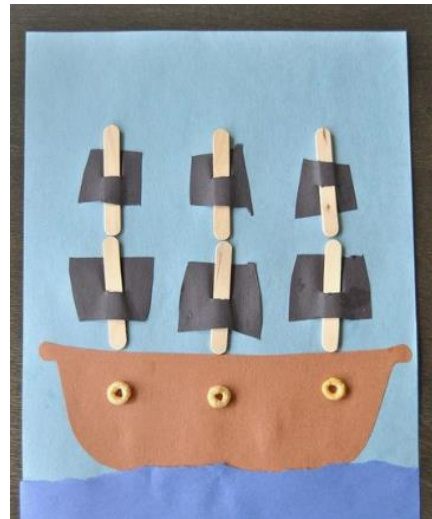

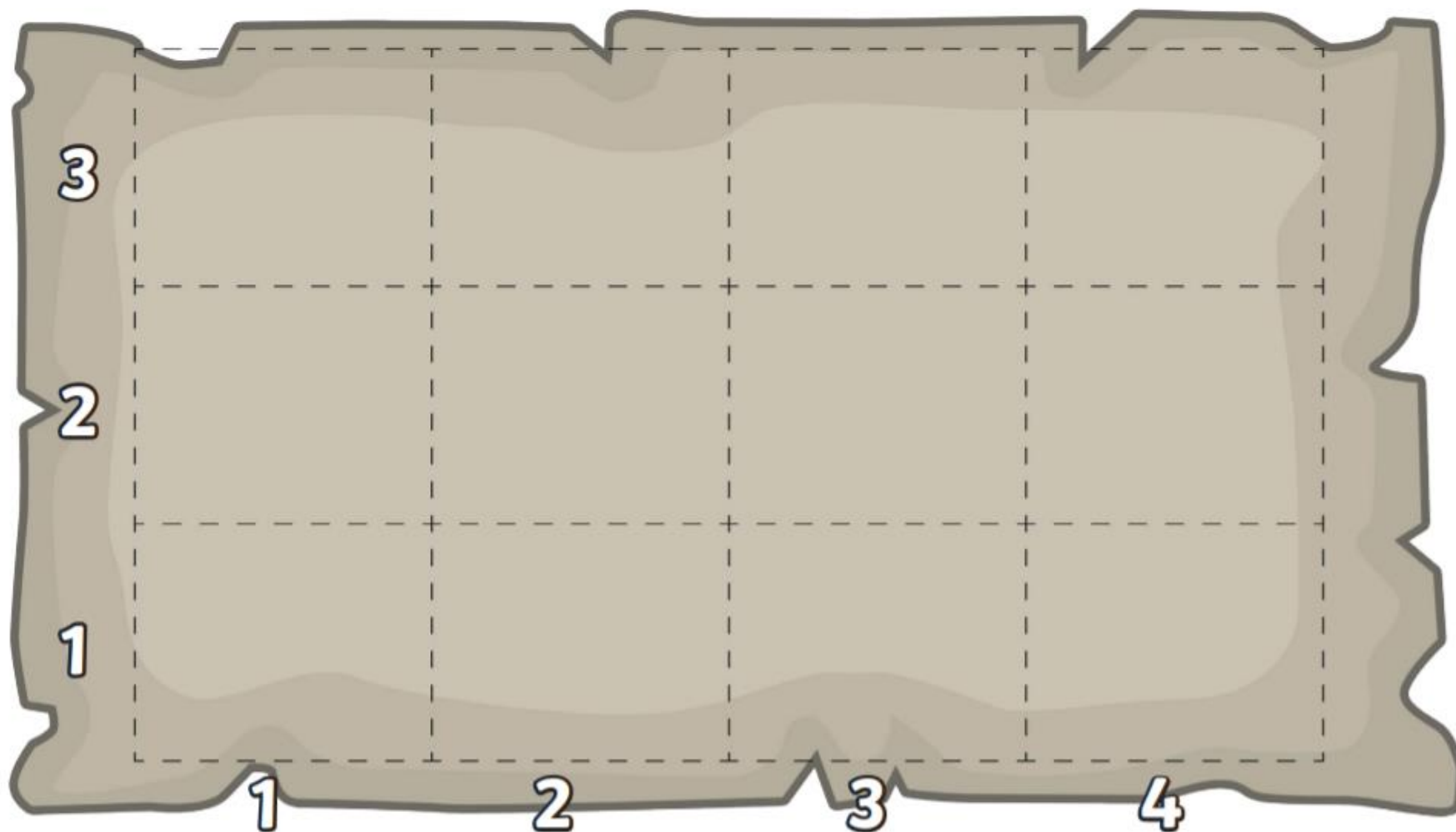




## Mark Making Activity

# Physical Development Activity

## **You will need:**

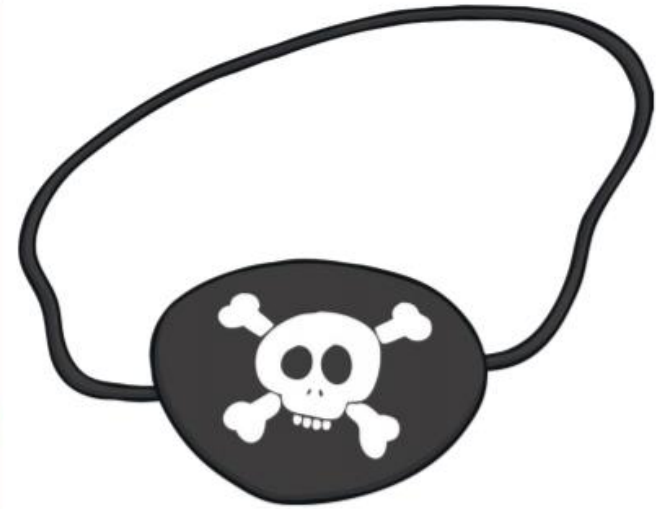
Pirate eyepatch template

Black colouring pencil or felt-tip pen

Scissors

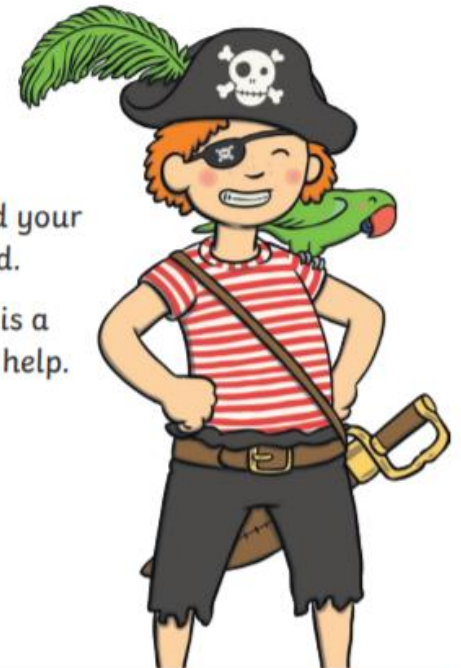
Elastic or string

Sticky tape



## **What to Do:**

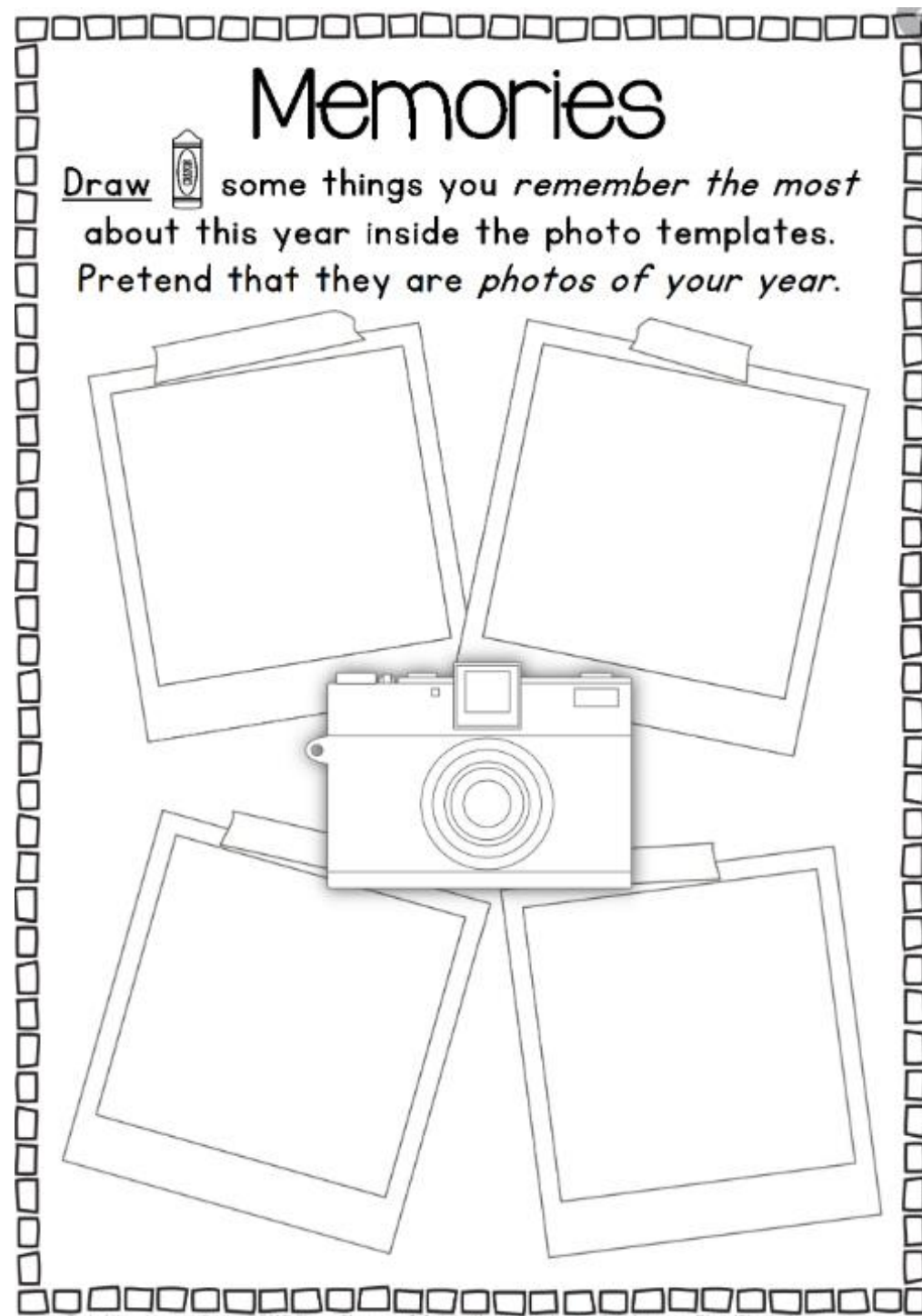
1. Colour in the pirate eyepatch template (provided). Remember to leave the skull and crossbones white.
2. Carefully, cut out the eyepatch.
3. Ask a grown-up to help you put holes in the eyepatch where the little circles are.
4. Get the elastic or string and put it around your head to work out how much you will need.
5. Then, thread this through the holes. This is a bit tricky, you might need a grown-up to help.
6. Use the sticky tape to keep the elastic or string in place.



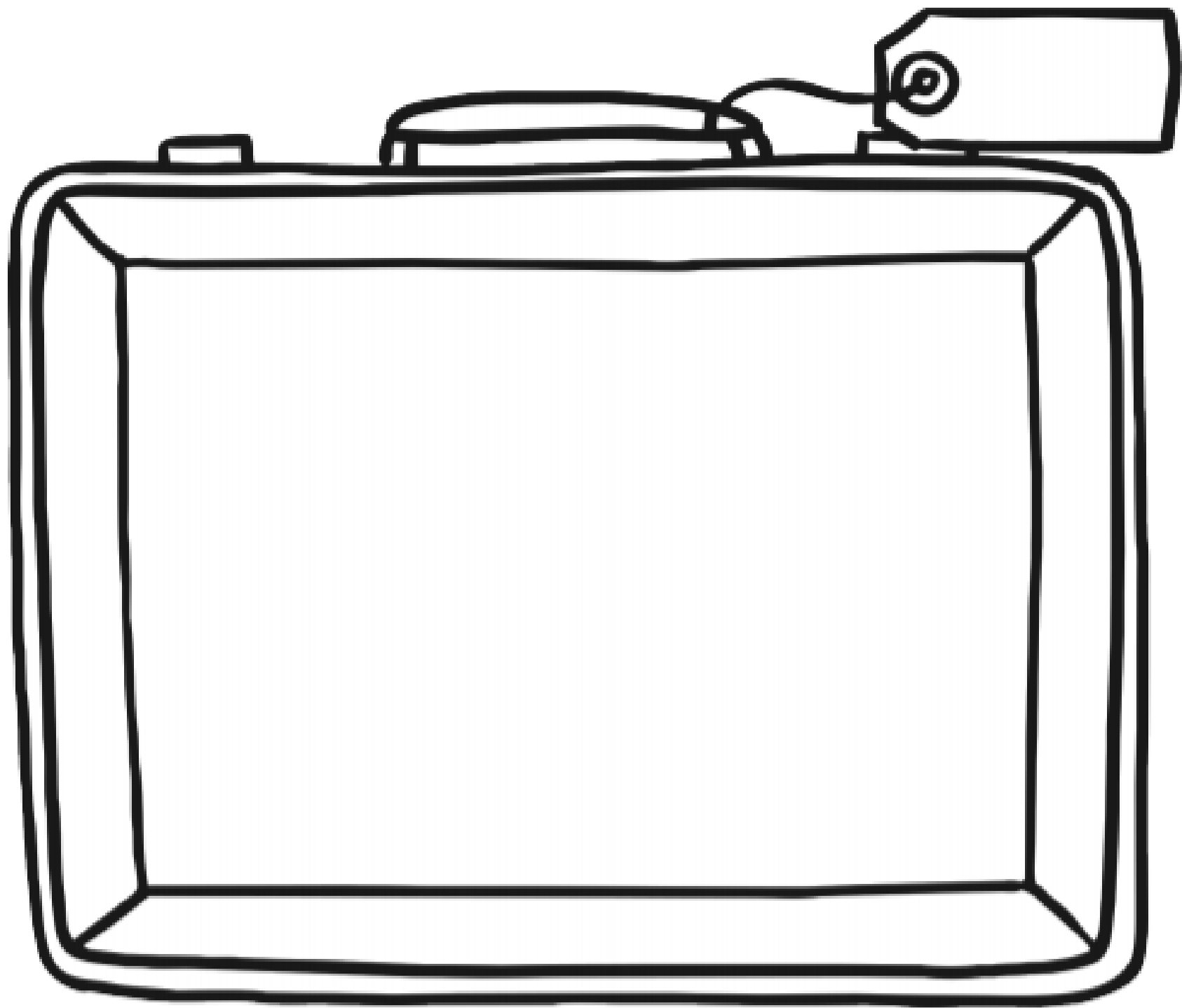

What will you call your ship?

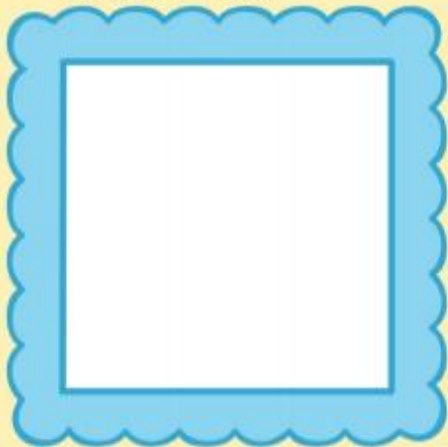
